# Dear supporter friends,

As I write this letter amidst the freedom and economic blessings most of us experience in the USA, I am keenly aware of the missiles and bombs dropping on the people of Ukraine at this very moment. Our dedicated Ukrainian national workers, with the help and direction of our evacuated American staff, are courageously doing what they can to try to help people suffering the ravages of war.

I am reminded of the scripture in Matthew 24:6-8: "And ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars: see that ye be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet. For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: and there shall be famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes, in divers places. All these are the beginning of sorrows."

In addition to the thousands of people killed and the millions fleeing the Ukraine/Russia conflict, we are also aware of the ongoing conflicts and mass displacements of people in Yemen, Myanmar, Syria, Ethiopia, Afghanistan, and other countries. Not since World War II has the world seen so many refugees and internally displaced people.

In addition to the wars and uprisings mentioned in Matthew 24, it also references famines (hundreds of millions around the world are facing a hunger crisis), pestilences (COVID-19 has claimed the lives of an estimated six million), and earthquakes (two in Haiti in 2021 killed several thousand people and destroyed hundreds of homes). In the face of news like this, it is very important that we do as Jesus encouraged us in verse 6: "... see that ye be not troubled." God is, after all, in control of our lives, and as children of His we can find peace and rest both now and eternally. Praise the Lord! THANK YOU VERY MUCH for your faithful prayers, contributions, and volunteer work in 2021!

Together, we are privileged to show forth the love of Christ and make a difference in the lives of millions of people who find themselves in difficult circumstances.

Your generosity blesses untold numbers of the widowed, orphaned, elderly, sick, and handicapped, as well as poor families and schoolchildren, in many parts of the world. Storm victims in the USA are blessed and encouraged through interaction with volunteer workers. Many impoverished people learn how to become self-sustainable. Your support enables us to provide Bibles for large numbers of believers who eagerly seek a copy of the holy Scriptures. The Word of God also goes forth in the forms of Christian family magazines and Biblical Discipleship seminars. Millions of people are reminded of God and their appointment with Him through Gospel messages along America's highways.

It is a wonderful privilege for us to work with you as, together, we seek to be "the hands and feet of Jesus" on this earth. To HIM be all honor and glory; HE alone is worthy (Revelation 4:11)!

# **Purpose Statement**

Christian Aid Ministries was founded in 1981 as a nonprofit, tax-exempt 501(c)(3) organization. Our main purpose is to glorify God and help enlarge His kingdom: "... whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God" (I Corinthians 10:31).

CAM strives to be a trustworthy and efficient channel for Amish, Mennonite, and other conservative Anabaptist groups and individuals to minister to physical and spiritual needs around the world. This is in response to the command, "... do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith" (Galatians 6:10). Our goal is to connect people who want to help with people who need help.

Install Gospel billboards along America's major highways.

Support church planting efforts in Romania, Haiti, and Liberia.

Operate medical clinics in Haiti and Nicaragua.





# Haiti Kidnapping

A huge thank you to the many Christians around the world who prayed for us during the difficult two months when our workers were held hostage in Haiti. Following are excerpts from updates we gave throughout the time we waited for their deliverance.

October 17, 2021: We request urgent prayer for the group of Christian Aid Ministries workers who were abducted while on a trip to visit an orphanage on Saturday, October 16. We are seeking God's direction for a resolution, and authorities are seeking ways to help.

The group of sixteen U.S. citizens and one Canadian citizen includes six men, six women, and five children. Join us in praying for those who are being held hostage, the kidnappers, and the families, friends, and churches of those affected. Pray for those who are seeking God's direction and making decisions regarding this matter.

October 21, 2021: Letter from families of the hostages:

Dear church of Christ around the world,

Thank you for your prayers on behalf of our family members who are being held hostage in Haiti. God has given our loved ones the unique opportunity to live out our Lord's command to "love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you" (Matthew 5:44).

God invites us to call upon His name in the day of trouble (Psalm 50:15). We thank Him that He is God, and ask Him to hear our prayers and bring our families home. We also pray that the light of God's love might shine out into the darkness of sin, and that the gang members might be freed from their bondage to sin and experience freedom in Jesus Christ.

Thank you, brothers and sisters in Christ, and PLEASE keep praying!

October 23, 2021: Today marks one week since our workers and loved ones were kidnapped in Haiti. This group is still being held hostage. It has been a week of many tears and thousands-if not millions-of prayers.

November 10, 2021: God created you for ministry. If you are not serving, you are just existing. God wants to use you to make a difference in this world. This saying is posted on the desk of one of our workers who is being held hostage in Haiti. This person, along with the others who were kidnapped, had a heartfelt desire to serve the people of Haiti.

November 12, 2021: It is now the twenty-eighth day since the kidnapping in Haiti took place ... Admittedly, the waiting is difficult. November 16, 2021: Throughout the past month ... we have

received hundreds and hundreds of encouraging letters from ca ing people in forty-five states and fifty-five countries.

November 21, 2021: We have learned that two of the hostage in Haiti were released. We praise God for this!... The two hostage who were released are safe, in good spirits, and being cared for

November 24, 2021: Thanksgiving Day is tomorrow ... Familie get together on this special day to thank God for His blessings duri the past year and enjoy good food and fellowship. Overshadowin all of this is the fact that fifteen of our loved ones are still held ho tage in Haiti.

November 30, 2021: We are aware that numerous kidna pings-mostly of Haitian people-continue to take place in Haiti We recognize that other families are anxiously awaiting the retu of their loved ones.

December 3, 2021: Next week, on Monday through Wednesday,





# What is our plan going forward?

COVID lockdowns have eased in many parts of the world, but the devastating economic fallout continues in many countries. Sources of income have diminished while the costs of food and other goods continue to skyrocket. In 2022, we plan to transition from Coronavirus Crisis Care to a new World Hunger Fund program that will enable us to help meet the ongoing need for food in various places.

# **Disaster Response Services USA**

## DRS Rebuilding - Rapid Response Services - Loaves & Fishes Food Kitchen - Chaplain Ministry Program

The Disaster Response Services programs provide a way to reach out to our "neighbors" in the United States. Our goal is to be the hands and feet of Jesus in times of distress and loss. Here is an overview of our 2021 activities.

DRS Rebuilding: CAM set up rebuilding bases in Beaumont, Texas; Chattanooga, Tennessee; Moss Bluff, Louisiana; Westlake, Louisiana; Barceloneta, Puerto Rico; and Gates, Oregon. Coming from various states and provinces, 1,349 volunteers joined their skills to rebuild and restore 179 damaged and destroyed homes.

Rapid Response Services: In 2021, Rapid Response Services helped clean up after ice storms, windstorms, tornadoes, and floods. More than 1,100 people were blessed by 2,635 volunteers who left their homes to help in disaster-stricken areas.

Loaves and Fishes Food Kitchen: CAM's Loaves & Fishes Food Kitchen is operated by the New Order Amish and provides hot meals to people in disaster areas. In 2021, Loaves & Fishes volunteers spent 12,436 hours to serve 34,863 meals in the wake of Hurricane Ida in Louisiana.

Chaplain Ministry Program: Natural disasters like tornadoes, hurricanes, and floods often leave people traumatized and in need of Christ-centered support. During 2021, Chaplain Ministry workers traveled to various states to give support and guide survivors to Jesus, our true rest and hope.

The mission of CAM's Search & Rescue program is to reunite missing individuals with their loved ones. Helping to search for lost and missing persons gives us an opportunity to reach out with Christ's love and touch the lives of people right here in our homeland.

Our trained Search & Rescue teams include volunteers from Anabaptist communities in Arkansas, Illinois, Minnesota, Missouri, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Virginia.

# **Billboard Evangelism**

Each day CAM's Gospel billboards prompt millions to consider their spiritual condition. What a privilege it is to minister to troubled souls and point them to God! Our phone team addresses a generation alarmingly unattached to the Bible. Many Americans are fearful, confused, or close to despair.

More than 1,500 Gospel billboards are posted throughout the United States. We pray that God would use the simple messages "to open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins ... " Acts 26:19

# In 2021:

# **Conservative Anabaptist Service Program (CASP)**

CASP's foremost goal is to provide alternative places of employment approved by the United States Selective Service System (SSS) where conscientious objectors can serve their required time, should the U.S. government activate a draft.

Twenty church constituencies are signed up under the CASP

program. CASP coordinates with these groups on pilot projects where service-age men work as if a draft was in place. Projects last at least four weeks per group and usually include forestry work or rebuilding homes in disaster areas.

# **International Crisis 2021 projects**

# \$1,000,000 - \$3,500,000 projects

**Afghanistan Crisis:** Afghanistan's government fell in August 2021. The Taliban, a Muslim extremist group, took control. Many people fled the country, while others are stranded inside Afghanistan and face hunger and other difficulties. CAM worked through contacts to provide food, emergency supplies, and other aid to needy Afghans.

**War in Yemen:** The war in Yemen started in 2014 and has now passed the eight-year mark. The conflict continues with ceasefires never holding for more than a short time. Millions of Yemenis experience desperate needs and severe hunger. CAM supplied food, water systems, comforters, hygiene kits, and other aid.

**Middle East Refugee Crisis:** Although active fighting largely subsided in Syria, the aftermath is far from over. We provided food, hygiene items, blankets, Christian literature, medical care, heating assistance, schooling for refugee children, and other aid for people affected by the wars in Syria and Iraq.

# \$250,000 - \$1,000,000 projects

**Venezuela Economic Crisis:** The economic crisis in Venezuela left multitudes in great need. We worked through conservative Anabaptist contacts to provide food and Christian literature in Venezuela and surrounding countries like Peru and Colombia.

**Bangladesh Rohingya Refugee Crisis:** In 2017, the Rohingya people fled to Bangladesh because of violence in Myanmar. This created the world's largest refugee camp. In 2021, supporters' funds made quality medical care available for Rohingya refugees. In addition, the SALT Agri-Plus program helped refugees develop and improve garden plots to grow food for themselves.

**Haiti Political Crisis:** To respond to the ongoing political and economic crisis, CAM operated Work-for-Wages projects such as repairing roads and developing water systems. These projects enabled needy Haitians to earn an income while doing projects to benefit their communities.

**Israel/Gaza Conflict:** For eleven days in May 2021, militants in Gaza, the strip of land between Israel and Egypt, launched thou sands of rockets into Israel. The Israeli military retaliated by carrying out hundreds of airstrikes in the Gaza Strip. In the aftermath, CAN provided food and other aid.

**Lebanon Economic Crisis:** Throughout 2021, the economic situation in Lebanon continued to degenerate as the value of currency plummeted. CAM provided food and hygiene items.



**Haiti:** The political crisis in Haiti made it challenging for American SALT staff to continue living in the country. By the end of 2021, many of the staff members returned home. National SALT staff members continue operations in Haiti with American directors administrating remotely.

**Bangladesh:** COVID-19 related government lockdowns in April and again in July caused difficulty for SALT members to meet for their weekly savings and teaching meetings. Thankfully, by September restrictions were lifted and meetings normalized again. Despite the difficulties, over 1,000 members were added to the program throughout the year.

**Grenada:** The SALT program is in the process of starting in the country of Grenada. As usual, when starting in a new country, it can be challenging to get individuals interested in forming savings groups.



# **Descriptions and updates**

**Adopt-A-Family** Communism collapsed in Eastern Europe more than 30 years ago, but its effects are still seen today. The cost of living continues to rise in spite of low incomes, and families wonder how they will survive. For the poorest families in Romania, Moldova, and Ukraine, food parcels bring a ray of hope. Adopt-A-Family parcels are mostly for struggling Christian families, but some parcels are distributed to unbelievers as a means of outreach. This program also helps support needy recipients in the Middle East and families in Nicaragua, the second poorest country in the western hemisphere. Each sponsorship of \$75 a month sends a 50-pound parcel of food and healthcare items to those in need.

Adult Disposable Briefs Adult disposable briefs are a critical need almost everywhere in the world CAM works. Briefs are distributed to people who care for the elderly, paralyzed, or handicapped. Adult briefs are vital in easing the burden of caretakers who have limited resources and often live without running water or indoor plumbing.

**All-Nations Bible Translation** Thousands of tribal groups go through life without a copy of the Bible in their own language. CAM supports All-Nations Bible Translation, an Anabaptist-based organization that coordinates Bible translation to fill this need. Funds are used to train and support translators, produce quality Bible translations, coordinate community development projects, and help plant churches that apply these Scriptures.

**Biblical Discipleship Centers** Pastors, teachers, and other men receive teaching at CAM's Biblical Discipleship Centers in Haiti, Liberia, and Nicaragua. Three-week seminars cover topics like spiritual warfare, family life, and leadership. The goal of these seminars is to promote sound doctrine to attendees so they can influence their churches in a Biblical way.

**Bibles-for-the-World** At the heart of CAM programs is the goal to get God's Word into as many hands as possible. In 2021, donations to this program helped provide 4.5 million Bibles. To spread the words of truth, we also use the avenues of Bible story books, inspirational books, and Bible correspondence courses. God has opened the door to distribute some of these items in unique places of the world, including closed and restricted countries.

**Billboard Evangelism** Many Americans call themselves Christians but do not follow Biblical principles. Others refuse to acknowledge that God exists. To remind people of God and His truth, CAM has posted more than 1,500 Gospel messages across the United States. Most of these messages are posted on billboards along interstates and major highways. Thousands of people call our toll-free number, searching for answers about God, the Bible, and life issues. More than 108,000 calls were logged in 2021. Of

these callers, some chose to listen to recorded messages, and others chose to speak to a phone team member.

Blankets for the Poor Millions of people in the world's poorest countries are ill prepared when winter hits. Many of them lack money for food so buying blankets is out of the question. People often suffer from the cold, and some even freeze to death. Although we ship thousands of donated comforters around the world, we are unable to ship comforters into many countries. In these countries, we provide funds to purchase blankets in the country to distribute to the needy. On average, the delivered price of a good, warm blanket bought directly from factories is about \$25.

Christian Family Magazines Biblical teaching material is in great demand in many parts of the world. CAM responds to this need through the Seed of Truth and Antorcha de la Verdad (Torch of Truth) magazines. Both magazines are written by conservative Anabaptists and include articles and stories for children, youth, and adults. They are printed in 10 languages and distributed in approximately 100 countries and territories. In 2021, supporters provided 12 million Seed of Truth and related magazines and 1.8 million Antorcha de la Verdad magazines.

Christian-Martyrs-Fund Over the years, pastors and other Christian workers in Vietnam, the former Soviet Union, and the Middle East faced tremendous persecution. As a result, some suffer physical and mental disabilities that make it difficult to earn a living. The Christian-Martyrs-Fund supports such pastors and Christian workers with money for food, clothing, medical needs, and other necessities. In some cases, this program sponsors the widows and children of people who were martyred for their faith. The program also provides special assistance to believers facing or fleeing persecution.

Christian Schooling for Eastern Europe The Romanian public school environment is becoming increasingly hostile to Christian values. Immorality and secularism are fast making inroads and leaving negative effects. Many Christians are desperate for an alternative but don't know where to turn or how to get started. The vision for this program is to provide a Christ-centered solution to the schooling needs of Christian families in Romania and several surrounding countries. The program provides teacher training and supports workers who visit and encourage families. More than 940 students are enrolled.

Church Planting Projects When CAM establishes a base in a country, we feel the need to have a church nearby that shares our beliefs. These churches benefit our field staff and open spiritual opportunities in the community. CAM financially supports church-planting efforts in Haiti, Romania, and Liberia. Among the five supported churches are 193 members. Funds are used to provide meeting places and cover the costs of ministry trips and other needs.

Clothing Bundle Project This program ships large amounts of guality used clothing to many parts of the world. Supporters also provide footwear, fabric, and thousands of comforters. The items are sorted by volunteers and staff at our clothing centers in various states. Although the items are donated, there are costs involved in getting the items to their destination. Every gift of \$69 processes, ships, and distributes approximately 125 pounds of clothing, footwear, and comforters. In some cases, funds are used to purchase clothing, shoes, and blankets to meet specific needs.

Comforter Project CAM receives thousands of cozy, handmade comforters from sewing groups and individuals each year. These comforters are in high demand around the world and help bring warmth and cheer to those in need. Funds from supporters help ship them to their final destinations. Comforters are distributed to families in Eastern Europe, refugees in the Middle East, and others in various locations. Comforters are also a blessing in tropical countries where recipients sometimes use them as beds or blankets during damp and rainy weather.

Milk-for-Many-Mouths This program provides free, fresh milk to needy orphanages, hospitals, and families in Romania. Many Romanian families cannot afford to buy milk or keep a family cow. In 2021, this program distributed approximately 29,350 gallons of milk. More than 1,000 people benefit from this nutritious supplement to their diet each week.

Nicaragua-Adopt-A-Family Nicaragua is the second poorest country in the western hemisphere. Eighty percent of its population lives on only two to three dollars a day. Sponsors help 750 Christian families each month by providing them with 45-pound parcels of food, medicines, and healthcare items. The families also receive the Antorcha de la Verdad (Torch of Truth) magazine for spiritual nourishment.

Potatoes for the Poor Potatoes are a staple for people in Central Asia and Eastern Europe. In some former Soviet countries, people sometimes refer to the potato as their "second bread" because they incorporate it into various parts of their daily diet. Rich in nutrients, potatoes rank as one of the world's most important crops. CAM is providing potatoes to impoverished families and individuals in Central Asia and Eastern Europe where economies are declining, job opportunities are limited, and inflation and food prices are rising. People are grateful to receive potatoes to help them through the long, cold months of winter.

Project Baby Moses Expectant Israeli mothers often face tremendous pressure-physically, spiritually, and financially. Abortion rates in Israel are high, and in many cases the government even funds abortion. Through Project Baby Moses, CAM supports several crisis pregnancy centers in Israel that offer hope, counsel, and assistance to needy mothers. The baby items, spiritual guidance, and emotional support encourage women to carry their babies to full-term. We are exploring options of starting this program in other countries.

Project Good Samaritan This fund meets pressing needs that arise from medical emergencies, house fires, or other unexpected crises. Poverty-stricken people often cannot save for such emergencies and are destitute when they occur. Project Good Samaritan is used primarily in countries where CAM has ongoing projects or field staff, but some funds may be used to meet similar needs in other locations.

Refugee Discipleship Program The influx of thousands of refugees into Greece provides an opportunity to share the Gospel with people who may not hear it otherwise. Most of these refugees are from closed countries where the government restricts the spread of Christianity. We desire to disciple refugees in Greece before they move to other parts of Europe or are forced to return to their home countries. Our staff hold Bible studies and operate an agriculture project to train refugees to start their own agriculture businesses.

SALT Microfinance Solutions SALT is an acronym for Shared Accountability, Lending, and Teaching. This program has two main objectives-to help people discover ways to provide for

their families and to pattern and teach a Biblical way of life. At Students learn useful, practical skills such as sewing, welding, frequent SALT meetings, clients are taught basic business princiand auto mechanics. Utilizing these skills helps them work their ples such as how to market goods, keep good records, and work way out of poverty, contribute to the needs of their communiwith customers. SALT Microfinance Solutions Salt & Light: Many of our neighbors in the United States are reaches out in the following ways:

Savings Groups: SALT savings groups help the impoverished become the solution to their own financial problems. These groups provide structure to help members work together to save money. As savings accumulate, members can take out small loans to start or expand businesses or help provide for their needs during hard times.

Microloans: Many people in developing countries want to operate a small business and provide for themselves but lack start-up capital. The microloan program uses funding from donors in the United States and issues small loans to help these individuals start or expand small businesses.

Agri-Plus: Farming in developing countries is difficult. Many farmers struggle to feed their families even though they work hard on their small plots of land. They may have the resources available to succeed, but they often lack opportunity and teaching to rise above poverty. Agri-Plus provides teaching on soil conservation, crop production, animal husbandry, and more. Our goal is for farmers to discover simple yet sustainable practices to improve their yields.

Vocational Schools: We continue to develop and operate vocational classes to help the poor in under-developed countries.



- afflicted with deep debt, broken homes, drug and alcohol addictions, poor financial choices, and more. Salt & Light provides Bible-based financial teaching that Anabaptist churches can use to build relationships with their neighbors and walk alongside them in their financial and spiritual difficulties.
- Save-A-Life Every day thousands of children and adults in impoverished countries die from malnutrition and treatable sickness. The Save-A-Life program has rescued many from joining these statistics. In most cases, sickness and malnutrition can be treated with nutritional items and proper medicines. The Save-A-Life program provides these life-saving items in Liberia, Nicaragua, Haiti, and other countries. Sometimes help arrives too late and disease and malnutrition have already claimed a life. But for hundreds of others, the nutrients and medicines give a chance to survive.
- Search & Rescue Each day many people go missing and create search and rescue incidents across the U.S. Our nine trained Search & Rescue teams are ready to respond quickly to help local authorities search for lost and missing persons. The goal for this program is to show God's love and provide support to those in distress.
- **Seed Project** This project provides quality vegetable seeds and supplies for families in Romania, Moldova, Ukraine, and other

countries who depend largely on their gardens for food. In countries like Liberia, Nicaragua, Haiti, and Kenya, CAM provides crop seeds and some agricultural tools and supplies for needy farmers. Our goal for the Seed Project is not only to provide physical seeds but also to plant spiritual seeds through Christian literature and teaching given with the seeds.

Sewing Centers Many women have learned to sew at CAMsupplied sewing centers and are thankful for the opportunity to provide for the practical needs of their families. Some of the items they make are distributed to other needy people. CAM stocks sewing centers in Romania, Ukraine, and Nicaragua with fabric, sewing machines, and notions provided by donors.

Sponsor-A-Refugee-Child Violence in Syria has forced many refugees to flee to surrounding countries. As parents struggle to provide food, shelter, and clothing, almost three out of five Syrian refugee children are not enrolled in school. The Sponsor-A-Refugee-Child program gives school-age refugees in Lebanon access to Christian education that could affect their entire lives. A donation of \$50 per month helps one student go to school.

Sponsor-an-Orphan More than 4,000 orphaned, destitute, and abandoned children in Liberia, Kenya, Nepal, India, and Haiti benefit from this program. For \$59 per month, sponsors provide them with food, clothing, medicines, Christian literature, and some schooling. These children live in orphanages or with Christian families or relatives. Besides providing physically for the children, our goal is to put them in settings where they can learn about Jesus and grow up to help spread the Gospel in their country.

Support-an-Orphan Strong Tower Children's Home in El Salvador provides a place of refuge, love, and security for abandoned or orphaned children. CAM provides the finances to operate the home, but it is administered by a board and executive committee from the conservative Mennonite churches in El Salvador.

Support-A-Widow Needy widows, widowers, and abandoned wives are some of the most vulnerable people in economically depressed areas. A donation of \$59 provides them with a 35-pound parcel of food, a Christian family magazine, healthcare items, and \$10 cash or its equivalent in other needed items. In 2021, supporters provided 21,888 parcels for recipients in Liberia, Haiti, Nicaragua, Romania, Moldova, Ukraine, India, the Middle East, and other places.

Warm-A-Family Many people in Romania, Moldova, Ukraine, and other cold-climate countries struggle to pay their heating bills or buy fuel to heat their houses during the cold winter months. The Warm-A-Family program helps by supplying firewood, coal, stoves and/or funds to pay heating bills. This assistance goes to families, widows, and elderly people who lack funds to heat their homes.

Water-for-the-World The average household in many parts of the world does not have access to water flowing freely from a spigot. Many people resort to using river water or stagnant pond water, which can result in life-threatening diseases. CAM supplies funds to provide wells, water tanks, water filters, and irrigation systems for people in Kenya, Haiti, Liberia, India, Cambodia, Gaza, and other parts of the world.

Water Systems for Yemen Polluted water sources in Yemen have caused huge cholera outbreaks. The deadly disease threatens many lives. Even if people know where to access clean water, many of them lack the money needed to transport it to their homes. To help provide clean water, CAM offers a water system that collects, stores, and filters rainwater. The need for these systems seems endless. A one-time sponsorship of \$500 provides a rainwater system and makes a big difference for one family.

Widows Care Fund To millions of women, widowhood is a lifelong sentence of disgrace and struggle. Labeled and abandoned, they face a lonely life of suffering. Over the years, our faithful supporters have enabled us to provide food parcels to needy widows around the world. But in seeing other needs, we launched this program to provide food, shelter, self-help resources like sewing machines and animals, or other aid. In some cases, we also help widowers and abandoned wives.

World Hunger Fund Rampant inflation, COVID-19 economic fallout, conflict, and other factors have dramatically increased the world hunger problem in recent years. In 2021, the United Nations reported that more than 155 million people across the globe face severe food insecurity, a significant increase from the previous year. Millions face each day wondering how they will feed themselves and their children. The World Hunger Fund enables CAM to respond to food-related requests from around the world. Funds help provide food and food-producing resources for desperately poor families in India, suffering people in war-torn Yemen, struggling families in former Soviet countries, and others without sufficient food.

Worldwide Refugee Crisis The last decade brought a dramatic increase of displaced people around the world. The number of people who fled their homes due to conflict, famine, and persecution nearly doubled from 40 million to more than 80 million. Refugees in the Middle East, Bangladesh, and other places seek safety for themselves and their families. Innocent people-parents, children, and the elderly-have fled their homes with few belongings. Many refugees depend entirely on the mercy of others. Supporters' funds provide help like food, emergency aid, and Christian literature to refugees and other people impacted by conflict and other causes of displacement.


Following are a few of the steps taken to ensure accountability:

### Administrative Expenses as a percent of income . (Total contribution income including gifts-in-kind)





### Independent Auditor's Report

The Board of Directors Christian Aid Ministries Berlin, Ohio

### Opinion

We have audited the consolidated financial statements of Christian Aid Ministries, which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2021, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the consolidated financial statements.

In our opinion, the accompanying consolidated financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Christian Aid Ministries as of December 31, 2021, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Christian Aid Ministries and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

# Responsibilities of Management for the Consolidated Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the consolidated financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of consolidated financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the consolidated financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Christian Aid Ministries' ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the consolidated financial statements are issued or when applicable, one year after the date that the consolidated financial statements are available to be issued.

# Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the consolidated financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they

would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the consolidated financial statements.

We have previously audited Christian Aid Ministries' December 31, 2020, consolidated financial statements and we expressed an unmodified audit opinion on those audited consolidated financial statements in our report dated March 25, 2021. In our opinion, the summarized restated comparative information presented herein as of and for the year ended December 31, 2020, is consistent in all material respects other than the restatement discussed in Note 16 in the notes to consolidated financial statements, with the audited consolidated financial statements from which it has been derived. See Note 16 in the notes to consolidated financial statements for additional information.

### Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

### General

Christian Aid Ministries (CAM) is incorporated as a nonprofit organization under the laws of Ohio. Its purpose is to provide a reliable and efficient channel through which the church can minister to physical and spiritual needs around the world.

### **Basis of Accounting and Presentation**

Financial statement presentation follows accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) pertaining to Financial Statements of Nonprofit Organizations. Under Financial Statements of Nonprofit Organizations, CAM is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to two classes of net assets consisting of net assets without donor restrictions and net assets with donor restrictions

### Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements include the accounts of CAM and its wholly owned for-profit subsidiary. TGS International, Inc. (TGS) is a United States based company that sells inspirational books and various food items, and provides freight-forwarding services. Intercompany transactions and account balances have been eliminated.

### Use of Estimates

The preparation of consolidated financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and disclosures of contingent assets and Equipment is capitalized when its cost or donated value equals or exceeds \$5,000 per unit liabilities at the date of the consolidated financial statements, and the reported amounts of item. Titled vehicles are capitalized regardless of cost. revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### Cash and Cash Equivalents

Fair value is defined under GAAP as an exit price, representing the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash held in checking and savings accounts and include market participants at the measurement date. CAM uses market information or assumptions investments in highly liquid debt instruments with an original maturity of three months or that participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. ### Inventory

Inventories consist of food, medicines, other supplies, and Christian literature. Inventory is stated at the lower of cost or net realizable value for items purchased and at the lower of fair value as of the date of donation or net realizable value for items donated. Gifts-inkind inventory totaled \$17,022,532 at the end of 2021 and \$14,632,841 at the end of 2020. CAM's gifts-in-kind inventory was distributed as follows in 2021 and 2020: \$7,056,452 (2021) and \$2,604,941 (2020) were located at U.S. warehouses; \$4,775,342 (2021) and \$5,638,237 located at CAM's foreign operational sites.

### Notes Receivable

Notes receivable are carried at the unpaid principal balance. CAM's notes range from interest free to 3.25% interest and are made to an affiliated organization or to foreign staff or nationals who are connected with CAM's program activities. Management periodically evaluates the collectability of its outstanding notes. When management concludes that a note's repayment is unlikely, the note is charged off. Notes receivable are immaterial to CAM's financial statements.

### Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are carried at cost for items purchased and at fair value at the time of donation for donated items. Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Maintenance and repairs are charged to operations when incurred. Renewals and betterments of a nature considered to materially extend the useful lives of the assets are capitalized. When assets are retired or otherwise disposed of, the assets and related allowances for depreciation and amortization are eliminated from the accounts and any resulting gain or loss is reflected in income. ### Fair Value Measurements

### Planned Giving Program

CAM has established a charitable gift annuity plan whereby donors may contribute assets in exchange for the right to receive a fixed dollar annual return during their lifetimes. A portion of the transfer is considered to be a charitable contribution for income tax purposes. The difference between the amount provided for the gift annuity and the liability for future payments, determined on an actuarial basis, is recognized as a contribution without donor restriction at the date of the gift unless the gift portion is restricted. Upon the death of the annuitant (or last joint annuitant) income distributions cease.

### Net Assets

The consolidated financial statements report amounts separately by class of net assets:

a)Net assets without donor restrictions are those available at the discretion of the board for use in CAM's ministries and other functions, and those resources invested in land, buildings and equipment.

b)Net assets with donor restrictions are those restricted by donors for specific operating purposes or for use in a future reporting period. Also included in this category are net assets subject to donor-imposed restrictions to be held in perpetuity such as endowments or irrevocable trusts.

### Revenue and Support with or without Donor Restrictions

Contributions are recorded with or without donor restrictions depending on the expressed intentions of the donors. Support or revenue is recognized as it is received or as it is earned.

### Future Interest in Real Estate

The future interest in real estate is recorded at fair value on the date of contribution. The donor and donor's spouse are responsible for utilities, property taxes, liability insurance, and maintenance costs to keep the property in good condition. CAM is responsible for property insurance.

### Donated Items (Gifts-in-Kind)

Support arising from donated items has been recognized in the accompanying consolidated financial statements. The value of the donated items is based on fair value at the time the items are received. Gifts-in-kind medicines are valued at the Red Book wholesale acquisition cost (WAC) if listed, or 70% of the Red Book average wholesale price (AWP) if WAC is not available, or 70% of reliable online retail pricing if neither WAC nor AWP are available.

### **Contributed Services**

A substantial number of volunteers have provided various skilled services that enable CAM to carry out its program activities and support functions. Services are determined based on hours of service donated at the average fair value of comparable services and are reported both as revenue and expense in the period performed. If contributed services are part of a capital project, the value of those services is capitalized. The value of contributed services recorded by CAM totaled \$547,408 in 2021 and \$475,932 in 2020. \$19,126 (2021) and \$50,398 (2020) were attributed to capital projects.

### Functional Classification of Expenses

CAM conducts numerous types of program activities that minister to the physical and spiritual needs of people throughout the world. Natural expenses attributable to more than one functional expense category are allocated based upon estimated time and effort of CAM's employees. Administrative expenses are supporting activities that are not directly identifiable with program activities. Fund raising expenses promote the solicitation of support from current and potential donors for its program and administrative activities. Administrative and fund raising expenses are funded from net assets without donor restrictions. When a program's expenses exceed specific donor funding, the deficit is drawn from net assets without donor restrictions.

### Income Taxes

CAM is tax-exempt under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. TGS is not tax exempt. Current income tax expense for TGS totaled \$17,356 and \$4,357 for 2021 and 2020, respectively.

CAM has adopted accounting principles related to accounting for uncertainty in income taxes. CAM's policy is to record a liability for any tax position taken that is beneficial to CAM, including any related interest and penalties, when it is more likely than not the position taken by management with respect to a transaction or class of transactions will be overturned by a taxing authority upon examination Penalties and interest related to undernavment of income taxes are not recorded as income taxes but as penalties and interest expense. Management has determined that it does not have any material unrecognized tax benefits or obligations as of December 31, 2021 and 2020. Years ending on or after December 31, 2018, remain subject to examination by federal and state authorities.

### **Comparative Data**

The consolidated financial statements include certain summarized prior year comparative information in total but not by net asset classification. Such information does not include sufficient detail to constitute a presentation in conformity with GAAP. Accordingly, such information should be read in conjunction with CAM's financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2020, from which the summarized information is derived.

### Reclassifications

Certain reclassifications have been made to the 2020 amounts to conform to the 2021 financial statement presentation.

### Foreign Currency Translation and Transactions

The functional currency of CAM is the U.S. dollar. The financial statements and transactions of CAM's foreign operations are generally maintained in the relevant local currency. Where local currencies are used, assets and liabilities are remeasured at the consolidated statement of financial position date at the exchange rate in effect at year-end. Income transactions that occur in foreign currencies are translated using the exchange rate on the date of the transaction. Expense transactions that occur in foreign currencies are translated using the exchange rate on the date that USD funds are exchanged to foreign denominations in order to pay expenses. This exchange rate is deemed to approximate the exchange rate on the date of the transactions. Gains and losses from foreign currency translation are included in the current year change in net assets.

### Subsequent Events Evaluation

Management has evaluated subsequent events through March 30, 2022, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

### Note 2 – Financial Assets and Liquidity Resources:

CAM's operations are primarily funded by contributions with and without donor restrictions. Those restrictions require that resources be used for specific program activities or in a future period. Therefore, CAM must maintain adequate resources to meet those responsibilities to its donors and certain financial assets may not be available for general expenditure within one year. As part of its liquidity management, CAM has a policy to structure its financial assets to be available as general expenditures, liabilities, and other obligations become due. CAM tries to maintain cash on hand at a minimum of ten weeks of its annual budget. It endeavors to keep about \$5,000,000 in its main operating checking account. Excess funds are invested in FDIC insured money market accounts and certificates of deposit with varying maturity dates. Also, the governing board would consider authorizing operational loans should it be deemed necessary to do so.

CAM has established a cash management program with a local bank. Deposits are transferred to and from a sweep account daily. The sweep account is funded with repurchase agreements. The repurchase agreements are backed by government securities and are held by another financial institution. The bank reserves the right to substitute the collateral prior to the repurchase date upon notice to CAM. Deposits in its sweep accounts totaled \$5,310,000 in 2021 and \$2,890,000 in 2020. Deposits not covered by depository insurance totaled \$744.099 at the end of 2021 and \$748.725 at the end of 2020. Management believes that any credit risk related to these deposits is minimal.

### Note 10 - Related Party Transactions:

In November 2005, Christian Aid Ministries entered into a joint ministries agreement with Christian Aid Ministries of Waterloo (CAMW), a Canadian nonprofit organization. The agreement sets forth terms by which both organizations can pool their resources to accomplish specified program objectives. These programs are conducted through the operations of CAM. The Canadian organization also operates a clothing center, with the shipments going to CAM's overseas operations. CAM received contributions of \$4,304,978 in 2021 and \$1,958,625 in 2020 from CAMW.

Christian Aid Ministries and Christian Aid Ministries Foundation (CAMF) are related organizations. Both organizations have the same governing board of directors. CAMF contributed \$2,053,649 in 2021 and \$900,817 in 2020 to CAM. As of the current year-end, CAME was holding \$3,000,000 of CAM's funds for investment in certificates of denosit This amount is included in CAM's investment in certificates of deposit, since CAMF has no variance power to utilize the funds for any other purpose.

### Note 11 - Employee Benefit Plan:

CAM provides a Section 403(b) Plan. Each employee is eligible to participate on the first date of employment. CAM does not provide matching contributions.

### Note 12 – Donor Concentrations:

CAM received \$29,210,059 of donated items from one donor in 2021 and \$25,645,683 from the same donor in 2020. These donations accounted for 17.93% and 19.35%, respectively, of CAM's total revenue for each year.

### Note 13 – Revenue from Contracts with Customers:

Revenue from contracts with customers should be recognized when the entity fulfills its performance obligations to its customers. The sources of revenue from contracts with customers are as follows:

Books and food items - Performance obligations are completed at the point of sale for walkin customers or at the time of shipment for items ordered. Payment is due at the point of sale or at the time of shipment. There are no formal, written contracts associated with the sale of these items. Contract assets include accounts receivable and there is not a return policy since returns would be infrequent and only for trivial amounts. Contract liabilities include deferred revenue when payments are received prior to the order being completed.

Freight-forwarding services - Management has determined that it only has one performance obligation related to its freight-forwarding services which is deemed completed when containers or items are ready for shipment. Customers are billed for incurred costs plus an administrative markup of up to 20%. Payment is due when containers or items are ready for shipping. Contract assets include accounts receivable and there are no contract liabilities associated with this revenue source.

Employee leasing – A small number of employees are leased to a related entity to work at a specific project. Payrolls are run on a bi-weekly basis and leasing income is earned during the course of each payroll period. There are no formal written contracts for its leased employees. Earned revenue is based on cost plus and administrative markup. Billing for these services occurs monthly and payment is due at billing. Contract assets include accounts receivable and contract liabilities include wages payable related to the leased employees

### Note 14 - Billboard Leases

CAM leases billboard space in its Billboard Evangelism program. Lease terms are generally less than twelve months in length. Monthly lease payments ranged from \$230 to \$62,100 in 2021 and ranged from \$166 to \$73,347 in 2020. These leases entitle CAM to place a gospel message at a single location or at multiple locations. At December 31, CAM had about 180 (2021) and 884 (2020) billboard leases. Lease payments approximated \$5,046,625 in 2021 and \$4.095.036 in 2020.

### Note 15 - Transfer of Assets to Organization:

As of the beginning of the current reporting period, CAM ceased management of a portion of its operations located in the Suceava area of Romania. The operations were assumed by American staff and national workers under the responsibility of another charitable organization. All of the assets and liabilities associated with the operation were transferred to the entity located in Romania. The following schedule details the assets and liabilities transferred:

### Note 16 - Correction of an Accounting Error in the Prior Year:

CAM's management discovered an error in the valuation of its foreign inventory valuation as of December 31, 2020. The error caused an overstatement in the prior year inventory balance. An entry to restate the prior year ending inventory was made to correct for this overstatement and this adjustment necessitated an adjustment to beginning net assets. Since comparative financial information is included in the financial statements, the prior period line items were restated to reflect this correction.
